

KENNETH LOGAN MACLEOD III

KENNETH LOGAN MACLEOD III, died at 71, on his birthday, 12 January 2010 in Venice, Florida following a lengthy illness. Brother of Scott R. MacLeod, Gary W. MacLeod, and Dawn Davis, and father of Kenneth L. MacLeod IV, Roderick G. MacLeod, and Alexander P. MacLeod. A graduate of Roosevelt High School, Honolulu (1956), he received a B.S. from the U.S. Naval Academy, class of 1960, where he co-captained the cross-country team. He performed his duties with distinction in Viet Nam, was awarded a Bronze Star, and noted by a chapter entitled "MacLeod's Navy" in the book "Brown Water, Black Berets." Following his active duty service, Kenneth subsequently spent decades as a civilian maritime engineer in Indonesia and Annapolis, Md. He was an avid, lifelong fisherman. In keeping with his desire, he will be buried at sea.
